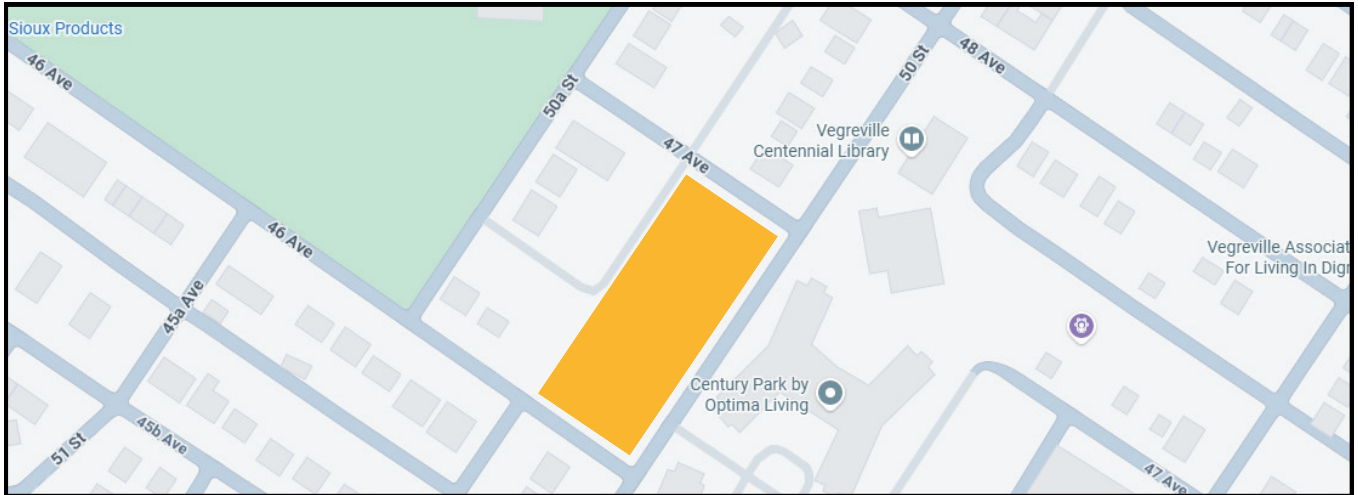
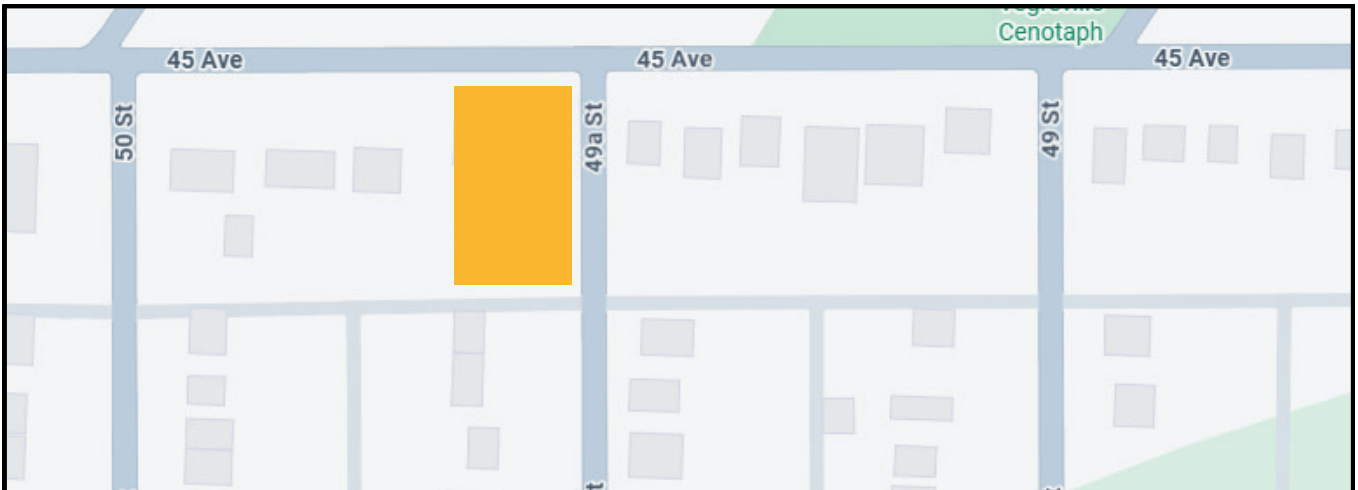

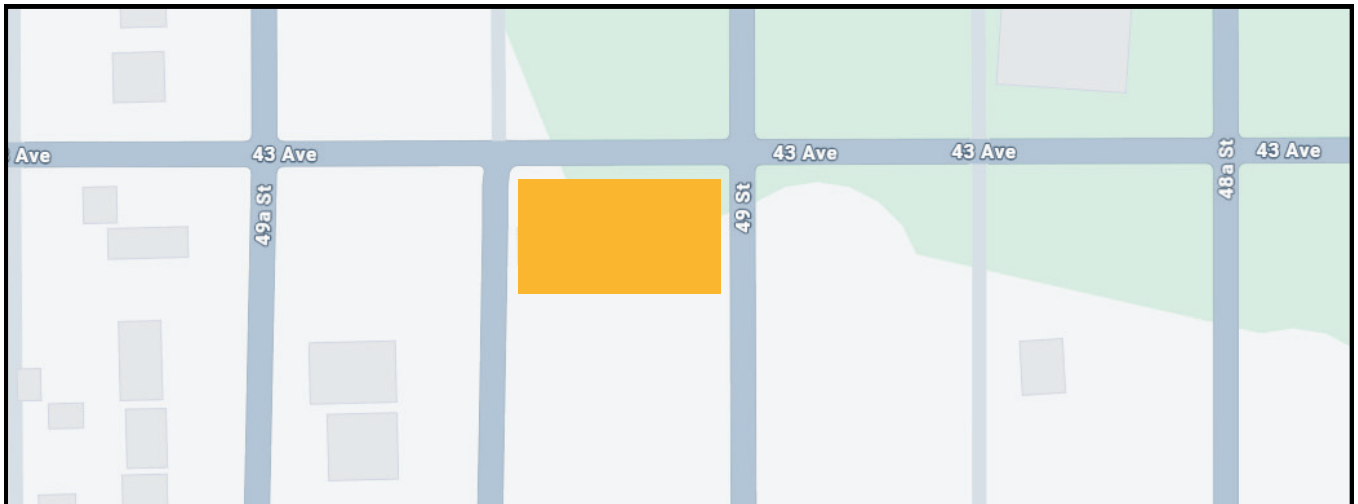
## 50 Street



## 45 Ave

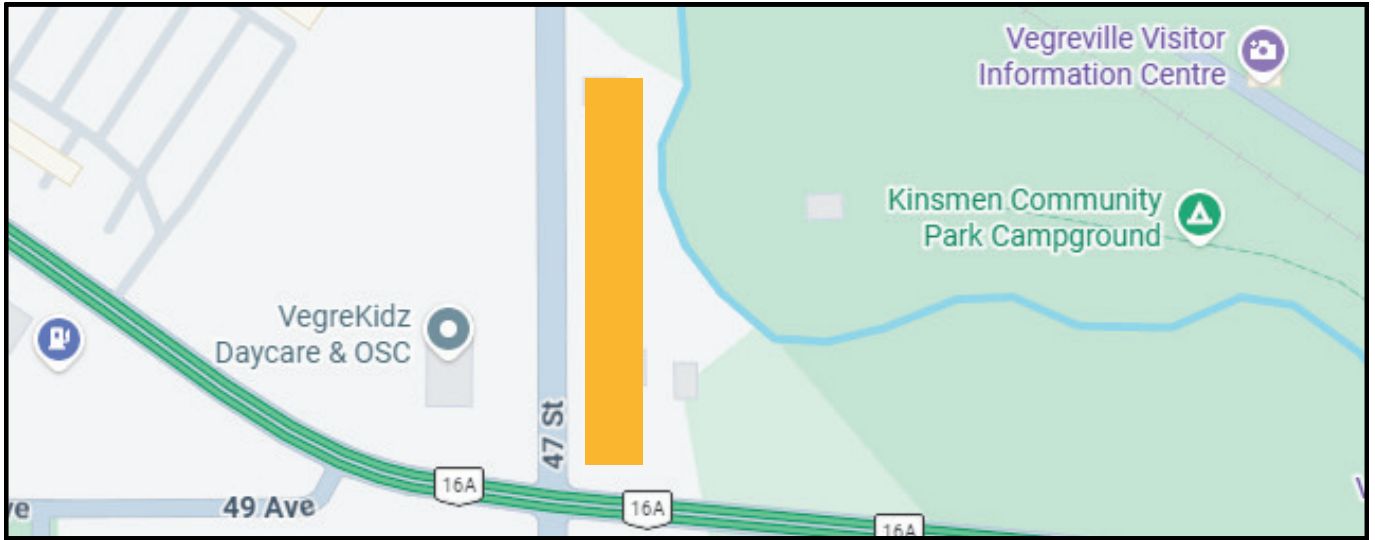

# Recycling Roll Out Collection: Tuesday

## ACCEPTED

- ✓ **CARDBOARD:** (corrugated/paperboard), cracker, cereal, pop/beer boxes, shoe boxes, paper towel tubes, cardboard egg cartons, paper bags, clean paper plates, brown packing paper, kleenex boxes. All boxes flattened, liners removed
- ✓ **NEWSPRINT:** journals, magazines, colored paper, phone books, calendars, construction paper, posters, tan packing paper, cards, books, wrapping paper, file folders, pictures, brown envelopes (all newsprint in its own bag)
- ✓ **WHITE OFFICE PAPER:** writing lined paper, legal, fax, white envelopes, white packing paper, white shredded paper (all white office paper in its own bag)
- ✓ **SOLID PLASTIC:** clean food and non food containers, shampoo, conditioner, hand lotion, laundry soap, margarine, kitty litter jugs, sour cream, ice cream pails, CD/DVD cases, food trays (all solid plastics in its own bag)
- ✓ **FILM PLASTIC:** shopping bags, grocery bags, sandwich baggies, dry cleaning plastic, saran wrap, bread bags (all film plastics in its own bag)
- ✓ **TIN/ALUMINUM:** cans- labels removed and clean rinsed food /non-food, tin foil, aluminum pie plates, cookie sheets (all tin/aluminum in its own bag)

## NOT ACCEPTED

- ✗ Wet, wax-lined, food-contaminated (food traces inside like pizza boxes) construction materials (floor dry, insulation, drywall) pet litter, ashes
- ✗ Paper towels, tissue paper, diapers, carbon paper, sanitary products, furnace filters, fabric softener sheets, napkins
- ✗ Tupperware, Styrofoam (food containers, packing & peanuts), vinyl, garden hoses, rope, toilet seats, window blinds, toothpaste tubes, Styrofoam egg cartons
- ✗ Black, green, orange bags, tarps, shower curtains, baler twine, tie straps, vinyl film
- ✗ Footwear, clothing, linens, towels

**\*Note: For safety reasons, other recyclable items like glass, inks/toners, rechargeable batteries, cell phones, and fluorescent tubes and light bulbs can be brought into the Vegreville Materials Recovery Facility (VMRF) at 5201-52 Avenue.**

**The Sanitary Landfill (located at 52321 Range Road 144, 1 kilometer east of 47 St & 61 Ave) has permanent collection sites for paint, electronic waste, tires, automotive batteries, household hazardous waste, metals, wood, concrete, and compost.**

**The VMRF will also securely shred your personal/confidential documents for a minimal fee**

# Compost Roll Out Collection: Wednesday

The Town of Vegreville collects compost from May to October (weather-dependent). The process is environmentally friendly and when done on a regular basis, reduces the amount of household waste entering our landfill, resulting in the reduction of greenhouse gases, which in turn, extends the life of the landfill.

## CONTAMINANTS

Contaminated compost is one of the major challenges our compost program faces, resulting in increased time and costs. Major contaminants include:

- Plastic Bags
- Trees
- Branches
- Concrete
- Rocks
- Metal
- General Garbage
- Glass
- Pet feces
- Cat litter

**Please ensure that when collecting compost that the items noted above are not included with your compostable materials.**

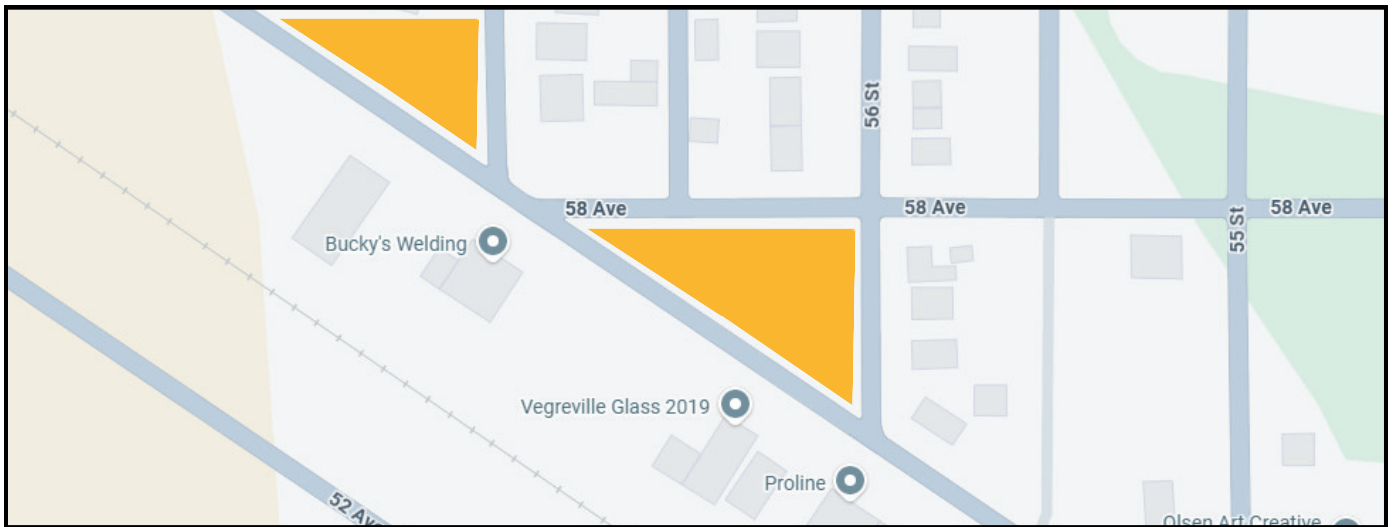
